## **Reflections of the Week**

"A mighty wind swept over the waters" in advance of the first moment of creation in the initial verses of the Bible (Genesis 1:2). Today we hear that when the Holy Spirit came to the apostles, the noise was "like a strong driving wind" (Acts 2:2). Wind is a driving force. It stirred up the chaos that preceded God's words of creation. It filled the house where the apostles met to pray with noise and fire. It drove their transformed voices out into the streets. Immediately after this scene, it propelled the disciples outside to the crowds, where they gave witness to God's mighty acts.

The mighty acts they were sure to speak of the most were Jesus' death and resurrection. God's unparalleled love and mercy has been made manifest for us through Jesus' sacrifice for our sins and his promise of eternal life. We received the Holy Spirit at baptism. Now the Spirit drives us to take up our common mission to proclaim the Good News—God's mighty acts—in unexpected and wondrous ways.

The coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost that we hear today starts with a detail that is easily overlooked or taken for granted. The disciples were gathered together in one place. This was not inevitable. After all, they had scattered like leaves in the wind when Jesus was crucified. But they were afraid then and they were still afraid now, on Pentecost. Yet they came together as one. Perhaps that was the work of the Spirit even before its manifestation. Similarly, the Holy Spirit draws us together today. Despite our various fears or concerns or preoccupations, we gather here as one to worship the Lord.

#### **Question of the Week**

How do I carry out the Christian mission in what I say and do? How can each of the gifts of the Holy Spirit—wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety, and fear of the Lord—aid in my mission?

## Eucharistic Adoration After the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday

## 28. What is the purpose of Eucharistic Adoration after the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday?

If the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion is to be celebrated the next day, the Blessed Sacrament is solemnly reserved in a separate repository at the end of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. While the primary purpose of this reservation is to provide the Eucharistic bread that will be distributed in communion on Good Friday, the adoration also serves as extension of the Eucharistic liturgy and an acknowledgment of the perduring (lasting permanently) presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

#### HAPPY BIRTHDAY!

We celebrate the founding of *our* Mother Church at the first Pentecost today! This event concludes the Easter Season when the third person of the Holy Trinity descended upon the Apostles, and their fears dissipated. They could not contain their explosive joy and firmness of faith, thus they began to spread Jesus' message far and wide. We, too, are to celebrate our birthday today as we join the Apostles in embracing the reality of the Spirit of God taking residence in our soul, as we are God's temple. This Sunday, priests will wear red vestments, symbolic of the burning fire of God's love and the "tongues as of fire" that descended on the Apostles. May we resort to our own Baptism and/or Confirmation when we also first received the anointing of the Third Person of the Holy Trinity.

#### THE HOLY SPIRIT ANIMATING

Can you identify how the Holy Spirit is at work animating our community at St. Mary's based on these images taken this past week? When we make the sign of the cross we conclude with the sweet name of the Holy Spirit and we open ourselves to receive the Holy Trinity. "Jesus is Christ 'anointed,' because the Spirit is his anointing,

And with this enormous power, so virtue, in all its forms, sets in motion mighty undulations of power. It has been stated that "evil" is the lack or loss of God's love. But evil is erased when God's love is restored by every act of virtue.

Has anyone ever been able to measure the power of a single act of kindness? Men who have never known God, often say that they came to this life-giving discovery because of the example of someone they chanced to meet. Many can only remember the occasion when it happened - - the individual faceless and nameless. But that act of virtue reflected God's love and power, in a moment of sharing.
